## Black Violin to Headline 2015 Levitt National Tour

Genre-busting duo of strings meets hip-hop to stop at six Levitt locations this summer

May 18, 2015—Fresh off last summer's success of the inaugural Levitt National Tour featuring World music sensation Playing For Change, we're counting down the days until Black Violin, the genre-busting pioneers of urban meets highbrow, headline the 2015 Levitt National Tour. Named one of the hottest bands at SXSW in 2013, this classically trained, hip-hop duo has wowed audiences across the globe with their unique take on violin/viola playing—from countless concert

arenas to headlining a Broadway show to performing at the 2013 Presidential Inaugural Ball.

"Black Violin's pioneering approach aligns perfectly with Levitt's artistic vision of excellence and inclusivity, creating boundary-busting music that resonates with people of all ages and backgrounds," says Sharon Yazowski, executive director of Levitt Pavilions. "In addition to their incredibly high-energy shows, Black Violin's deep commitment to community outreach will provide meaningful experiences with the duo at every Levitt tour stop."

The 2015 Levitt National Tour kicks off in Memphis on June 13, followed by stops at five additional Levitt locations—Arlington, Texas (June 20); Los Angeles (June 26); Pasadena, Calif. (June 27); Bethlehem, Pa. (July 11); and Denver (July 17). Audiences can expect a festive atmosphere at these family-friendly shows, filled with unexpected surprises that will get

everyone on their feet dancing. Following each show, there will be an on-stage Q&A with the artists Wil Baptiste (viola and vocals) and Kevin "Key Marcus" Sylvester (violin), who will share insights on their experiences and inspiration.

In addition to the free concerts and artist conversations in Levitt cities, Black Violin will visit local area schools and perform for students, part of their commitment to reach 50,000 children each year. "The outreach we do, we hold this very close to their hearts," says Baptiste. "Across the country, schools are cutting arts programs, in particular strings, and we're trying to raise awareness on their importance."

Along with pushing musical boundaries, Black Violin is committed to turning young fans on to their own potential. "We encourage kids to think creatively... Expand your mind. Once we get their attention with the music, that's the message we want to deliver," says Baptiste. This dynamic duo seamlessly bridges the worlds of classical and popular music, inspiring all ages with their creativity and positive message.
