Structural oppression is inequity across institutions and society. It's the cumulative and compounded effects of an array of factors that systematically privilege some groups (white people, men, able-bodied) and disadvantage others (BIPOC, women, LGBTQ+).

Interpersonal oppression occurs between individuals. It manifests as verbal or nonverbal communication and/or actions that harm, discriminate against, isolate and/or minimize the experience of those with no historical/structural power.

Institutional oppression occurs within institutions. It involves discriminatory treatment, unfair policies and practices, and inequitable opportunities and impacts.

Internalized oppression lies within individuals and is the acceptance and affirmation of a societal/dominant hierarchy. This manifests through one's conscious or subconscious thoughts and behaviors, and can be internalized as inferiority and superiority.
